HERDSMANSHIP will occur Monday – Thursday from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. each day; however, an adult must be in the aisle until 10 p.m. each day

Reminder that parents can help any time before 10 a.m. and after 7 p.m.

Reminder that nothing can be placed on the grates of the stalls.

Reminder that during the day, horses must be fed on the ground – not in nets or feed bags.

No eating in the barn.

No cooking in barn.

No tying in aisle way.

STATE MEETING Thursday 8/10 at 7 p.m. in hospitality tent (white tent behind expo hall)

HAUL-OUT will require stalls stripped/swept clean and all tack in front of stalls. Once this is done, find the person with the passes to check your stall. Once a pass is received, the horse may leave.

We are hoping to SHUT AISLES DOWN during decoration/tear down days; however, we will not know until closer to fair if this is approved.

GRAND ENTRY will occur Tuesday through Thursday around noon (must be coordinated with the fair court)

JUMPING and GREEN HORSE will be offered at Last Chance Show (not fair) and medals for these will be awarded at the Last Chance Show

There was discussion on how to make EDUCATION DAY not so chaotic. Kaileigh is looking into whether we can change education day to the following schedule:

Horse Judging 7:15 a.m. check in with start time at 8 a.m. (this is usually over by noon)

Around 11 a.m. Mini/Pony patterns will be set up after horse judging horses leave

FAIR ENTRY FORMS are due last day of June – period. If an entry form is not received for a member by this time that member will not be allowed to show at fair. The entry forms will be available on fair website and 4-H Horse Leader website.

HORSE JUDGING – Please ask members (not participating in Horse Judging) or others you may know of (adults or youth) who would be interested in being a Horse Judging Exhibitor. Stacy would like 8 volunteers total. Volunteers can choose to participate in one or all of Halter, Showmanship, Stock Seat, or Hunt Seat (one riding class will be a pattern). FAIR COURT CLINIC - May 9 - For any age person interested in fair court tryout. The fair court will go over make-up, wardrobe, speeches, and other aspects of fair court.

FAIR COURT HORSEMANSHIP CLINIC - May 15 (time TBD) — Those interested will bring their horse to the fairgrounds arena where they will be shown how to run the fair court horsemanship patterns (the pattern shown will be the pattern used for this year's tryouts).

SCHOLARSHIP – Applications are on-line ccehc.org. There will be at least 3 \$1000 scholarships given this year. Scholarships are not just for college but also any trade school. ALL 4-H members qualify for this scholarship!

ANNUAL TRAIL COURSE at Clark County Saddle Club – May 20 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. So far there will be at least 48 obstacles. Members - \$15 youth/\$20 adult; Non-members pay an additional \$5. Once fee is paid riders can ride any obstacle in any order until 3 p.m.

If you, or someone you know, plan on coming Saturday, it is recommended to get to the fairgrounds no later than 3 p.m. to avoid lines from the concerts. Otherwise, you will not be able to get in after 4 p.m.!

HORSE BOWL PRACTICE may be offered Saturday during the show.

Clark County 4-H Board Meeting

The subject regarding neurodiverse kids and how to best include and serve them was continued from the last meeting. Terry Lee Sharp had given a previous presentation and the group was enthusiastic for her facts. She will visit us again in April. Kirk is handling KYG and will give them the date and time. Kelly's position is still open and the position is posted.

Kirk said we have to do a budget very soon. He said the endowment fund interest has made us ahead of the principal. We will continue with scholarships. We are giving one of \$1500 this year. We gave three last year. We would like to do more but have to have enough interest in the funds and not dip into the principal.

Applications are due April 30.

June 3 is a Jamboree at the Fairgrounds with beef, Cavys, Rabbits, dogs, cats, poultry showmanship but not sheep. The Garden Club would like to join and can do a worm bin and a vegetable contest. Missy said we are getting emails about public presentations.
